The signing of MoUs with IIM Ahmedabad and the National Fire Service College, Nagpur, marks a significant leap towards fostering excellence and safety in port management.

Furthermore, we are proud to announce the release of our research report on Moreh. This report encapsulates our dedication to strengthening border connectivity, and I believe it will serve as a guiding light for future endeavors.

I extend my gratitude to each member of the LPAI family for their unyielding commitment and relentless pursuit of excellence. Together, we continue to forge a path towards seamless, efficient, and secure land port operations, fostering economic growth and regional integration.

I. Key Developments

Inauguration of Land Port Dawki

On 4th May 2023, Shri Nityanand Rai, Minister of State for Home Affairs in the Government of India, inaugurated Land Port Dawki in the presence of Meghalaya Deputy Chief Minister Sniawbhalang Dhar marking a significant milestone in the cross-border trade landscape.

The Dawki Land Port is located in West Jaintia Hills in Meghalaya, 55 kms from the district headquarters, Jowai, and about 84 kms from Meghalaya's capital Shillong. The corresponding Land Port in Bangladesh is Tamabil, located in the Sylhet district. This strategic port serves as a vital hubb for the movement of goods, passengers and vehicles between India and Bangladesh, fostering economic growth and cultural exchange.

During the inauguration MoS emphasized that the land port is expected to boost the tourism and business sectors. He said "This (port) has been made keeping in mind the two countries' requirements. It has good infrastructure, a slew of facilities such as go-down for cargo, canteen for tourists and electric substation. The aim is to bring together all the agencies and stakeholders under a single roof".

The development of Land Port Dawki was approved by High Level Empowered Committee (HLEC) of MHA on 4th February 2016. The Land Port is spread over a total area of 23.0 acres and has been built at an approximate cost of Rs 83. 38 crores. The Port has an array of modern and state-ofart infrastructure facilities such as Passenger Terminal Building, Cargo Terminal Building, Warehouse, Entrance/Exit Gate for Passenger and Cargo Vehicles, etc..

Inauguration of Land Port Rupaidiha and Ground Breaking Ceremony of Land Port Sonauli

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Nepalese counterpart Pushpa Kamal Dahal jointly inaugurated the Land Ports at Rupaidiha (India) and Nepalgunj (Nepal) in a virtual ceremony on 1st June 2023. This significant event marked a milestone in the bilateral relations between India and Nepal, reaffirming the commitment of both sides to strengthen connectivity, facilitate trade, and enhance people-topeople interactions.

The first Land Port in the state of Uttar Pradesh, Land Port Rupaidiha is located in the Bahraich district which is about 184 kms from the capital city of Lucknow. Development of Land Port Rupaidiha was approved by the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) on 20th December 2018. The Land Port is spread over a total area of 144 acres with a build-up area of 22,575 square meters and has been built at a total cost of approximately Rs. 200 Crores.

The Port has state-of-art infrastructure facilities that will streamline and expedite the movement of goods and passengers across the border, easing trade processes and promoting economic growth. In addition to the inauguration of these Land Ports, a ground-breaking ceremony for the development of Land Ports at Sonauli (India) and Bhairahawa (Nepal) was also performed by both the Prime Ministers.

Land Port Sonauli is located in the district of Maharajganj in the state of Uttar Pradesh, along the international border between India and Nepal. Sonauli-Bhairahawa is an important crossing point for domestic and international tourists, owing to its proximity to Lumbini, the birthplace of Lord Buddha and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The strategic location of the Land Port makes it an important access point for pilgrims and tourists visiting Lumbini, promoting religious tourism and cultural exchanges between India and Nepal.





















Strengthening Collaboration: MoU Signed Between LPAI and IIM Ahmedabad



This partnership is a testimony to LPAI's unwavering commitment to ensuring the safety and security of land port facilities, contributing to smoother operations and safeguarding the well-being of all stakeholders involved.





Streamlining Travel: Inauguration of "Yatri Subidha" Portal at Land Port Petrapole

In a significant stride towards enhancing passenger convenience and expediting clearance procedures, LPAI and the West Bengal IT Department joined hands to launch the "Yatri Subidha" portal on August 3rd, 2023, at Land Port Petrapole.

This innovative portal revolutionizes the way international passengers navigate through the Passenger Terminal. It empowers travellers to reserve specific time slots, ensuring a seamless and efficient clearance process. Through the user-friendly interface, passengers can effortlessly select their preferred date and slot. Subsequently, a Pass and a link/QR code are generated, which are promptly dispatched to the user's registered mobile number and email.

The "Yatri Subidha" portal stands as a beacon of collaboration between LPAI and the West Bengal IT Department, dedicated to optimizing the travel experience for passengers. By allowing individuals to plan their journeys with precision and convenience, this initiative is set to reduce wait times and enhance overall satisfaction. This forward-looking venture is poised to set a new standard in passenger facilitation, exemplifying LPAI's commitment to leveraging technology for the betterment of travel experiences. With the "Yatri Subidha" portal, Land Port Petrapole takes a significant leap towards a more efficient and traveller-friendly future.



II. Recent Activities

Land Port Petrapole Witnesses Historic Visit of Hon'ble Union Home and Cooperation Minister

On 9th May 2023, Land Port Petrapole was honored to welcome Shri Amit Shah, Hon'ble Union Home and Cooperation Minister, Government of India. This momentous visit marked a significant milestone for the port, as it witnessed the Foundation Stone Laying of 'Maitri Dwaar', alongside the inauguration of a Police Station and Hostel Building. The event was graced by an illustrious gathering, including the Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri Nishith Pramanik, Union Minister for Ports, Shri Shantanu Thakur and the Director General of Border Security Force.

Maitri Dwaar, the proposed second cargo gate at Land Port Petrapole will be developed as a joint gate on zero line along the India-Bangladesh border. This project marks a significant step towards enhancing the bilateral trade relations between India and Bangladesh, which will ultimately benefit the economies of both the countries. Currently, the daily cross-border traffic movement at Land Port Petrapole is around 600-700 trucks per day, which often leads to delays and congestion. To ease and streamline this daily traffic movement, the proposal to establish a common second cargo gate was conceptualized. The primary aim of this project is to speed up the release/clearance of goods at the border, which will benefit both Indian and Bangladeshi traders.

Union Home and Cooperation Minister also inaugurated the new Police Station building, which will provide requisite services for state security forces. The 3-storeyed RCC Structure with a total build-up area of 1670 sqm has been built at an approximate cost of INR 7 Cr. The building features a Police Station at the Ground Floor level and accommodation for Male & Female Police Staff on separate floors. It is equipped with Passenger Lifts, Central Air-conditioning, and Fire-fighting system. Additionally, the police station has bike and car parking inside the compound area.


Honourable Minister also inaugurated a new Hostel Accommodation facility for LPAI stakeholders, including Customs, Bureau of Immigration, Plant and Animal Quarantine Cell Officers, Health Officers, and more. The Hostel Accommodation is a 3-storeyed building with a total area of 637.5 square meters and features 34 rooms with a combination of triple shared occupancy and double occupancy. Each room is well-appointed with a 2- & 3-seater sofa, a bedside table, a dining table with chairs, and a study table. In addition to the rooms, the Hostel Building also has a common dining area that can accommodate 20-25 people, a recreational room, and a multipurpose room. These facilities have been designed to provide our stakeholders with the opportunity to relax and unwind after a hard day's work.



Release of LPAI Report "Strengthening Border Connectivity at India-Myanmar Border" and Panel Discussion on India-Myanmar Connectivity

LPAI released its latest report "Strengthening Border Connectivity at India-Myanmar Border" and hosted a Panel Discussion on India-Myanmar Connectivity on 14th July 2023 at India International Centre, New Delhi. Shri Prabhat Kumar IFS, Special Secretary (ER and DPA), Ministry of External Affairs was the Chief Guest on the occasion. In his welcome address, Chairman LPAI, Shri Aditya Mishra emphasized the importance of strengthening trade and connectivity between India and Myanmar and elucidated how Land Port Moreh has played a critical role in facilitating trade across the border. He also mentioned the significance of road infrastructure and related projects, particularly the Trilateral Highway, in boosting economy in Northeast India and improving bilateral relations with ASEAN countries.

Dr Prabir De, Professor, RIS presented the key findings of the report titled "Strengthening Border Connectivity at India-Myanmar Border". The Report sheds light on the economic principles underlying the Moreh border development and offers new ideas on how its potential can be better exploited in view of the upcoming connectivity projects. It identifies the constraints, challenges and bottlenecks at the India-Myanmar border and recommends policy measures to augment the border connectivity for LPAI and other central and state agencies. The Chief Guest, Shri Prabhat Kumar, complimented LPAI for the excellent work done by the organization in building infrastructure for facilitation of India's land borders. He praised LPAI for the crucial role it has played in facilitating safe and seamless cross-border movement of trade and passengers through land ports. He also emphasized the importance of Myanmar in the framework of India's Act East and Neighborhood First policies and described the plethora of connectivity initiatives the Government of India is implementing to improve regional integration with the Southeast Asian bloc.

This was followed by an enriching panel discussion which was chaired by Amb. Gurjit Singh, Professor, IIT Indore, and Former Ambassador to Germany, Indonesia, Ethiopia, ASEAN and the African Union. The panelists included Mr. Sabyasachi Dutta, Executive Director, Asian Confluence, Shillong; Mr. Afaq Hussain, Director, Bureau of Research on Industry and Economic, Fundamentals (BRIEF), New Delhi; Dr. Monish Tourangbam, Honorary Director, Kalinga Institute of Indo-Pacific Studies (KIIPS) and Ms. Cchavi Vasisht, Research Associate, Vivekananda International Foundation (VIF), New Delhi.

The concluding remarks were given by Shri Satish Kumar Sivan, Joint Secretary (DPA-III), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India who shed light on the status of the connectivity projects between India and ASEAN and how it is expected to strengthen India-Myanmar trade and connectivity.

A highlight was the field visit to Celebi Delhi Cargo Terminal Management, offering invaluable insights into on-ground operations. This practical exposure bridged the gap between theory and practice, ensuring a more comprehensive understanding.

A pivotal component of the program focused on performance measurement and evaluation. Participants were introduced to Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and benchmarking techniques specific to land port operations. The knowledge and skills acquired during the program are poised to have a profound impact on the efficiency and competitiveness of Indian land ports.








IV. Yoga Day Celebrations


